Who is Henry?

Henry is the largest recorded Triceratops fossil found. He lived around 65-67 million years ago. He was discovered in Weston County, Wyoming in 2013. He is 30 feet long and 11 feet tall. He is one of the only dinosaur fossils on public display in Missouri.



Fun Facts

- **Henry was named after the son of the Matt Forir, the director of the Museum of Natural Science.**
- **The fossil was originally nicknamed “Headless Henry” because his skull was not found at the dig site.**
- **About 40% of Henry’s fossil was recovered, including his pelvis, ribs, hind legs, and some vertebrae.**
- **He is about 30% larger than any other Triceratops fossils found.**
